Points for Prayer

Sunday 22nd June

Read Isaiah 1 Timothy 2: 1-2. ...I urge petitions and prayers, intercessions and thanksgiving be made for everyone, for kings and all those who are in authority, so that we may lead a tranquil and quiet life in all godliness and dignity. Pray for world leaders today. Presidents Trump, Zelensky, Putin and Macron. Prime Ministers Stamer and Netanyahu, Chancellor Merz and Ali Khamenei.

Monday 23rd June

Read Judges 3:9. The Israelites cried out to the Lord. So the Lord raised up Othniel son of Kenaz, Caleb's younger brother, as a deliverer to save the Israelites. Pray that in this time of incredible global instability that the Lord would raise up a leader to deliver, who will lead the world back from the chaos and war.

Tuesday 24th June

Read Exodus 17: 8-16. As long as Moses hands were held aloft the Israelites won the battle. Moses needed help in keeping his arms aloft, he didn't have the strength to hold them himself. Our world leaders do not have the strength to lead on their own, they need the support of public opinion and the prayers of the church. Pray for world leaders but also speak out so that public opinion can be changed and leaders encouraged on better paths.

Wednesday 25th June

Read Psalm 46:10. Stop fighting and know that I am God, exalted among the nations, exalted on the earth. Psalm 46 is much less a gentle reminder and more an urgent

command to **be still** as we traditionally read it. Pray this morning for world leaders who will be still, who will stop fighting and know that I am God. Pray for an event, a moment in time to bring the world to a stop in order that we would see Jesus.

Thursday 26th June

Read Psalm 91:4 He will cover you with his feathers; you will take refuge under his wings. His faithfulness will be a protective shield. It is always the poorest in society who suffer most in times of unrest and uncertainty. Pray that those who are homeless, lost, crushed and bereaved would know the shelter and protection of resting under God's wings.

Friday 27th June

Read 1 Kings 18:18. He replied, 'I have not ruined Israel, but you and your father's family have, because you have abandoned the Lord's commands and followed the Baals.' The prophet Elijah directly challenged the actions and behaviour of King Ahab. The role of the church is to directly challenge governments and leaders when they abandon the Lord's commands. Pray for wisdom and courage in how to challenge the choices world leaders are making today.

Saturday 28th June

Psalm 24. The earth is the Lord's and everything in it. After a week of praying in response to all that is going on in our world, take time today to remember that God still sits enthroned over all things and so we have hope and confidence, we have a reason to rejoice.
